After a timely meeting with the new Executive Director of the Red Cross of Ottawa County, Mr. Mike Mitchell, K9SKP, the Red Cross graciously offered us meeting space in their facility, so we have found a new "home" and must make changes to accommodate this move.

Beginning in January 2011 our General Membership Meetings will move to the second Monday of the month, and the Board Of Directors will meet the first Monday of the month.
